GSA-PAC performs well in primaries, but bank busted

Candidates supported by GSA-PAC did well in the May primaries, but GSA's advocacy funding has run out through its activity in multiple races. This means GSA will be unable to help re-elect incumbents in the November election who have helped protect physician-led perioperative care.

In the current 2017-2018 election cycle, GSA has contributed more than \$80,000 to 38 candidates for the state legislature and select statewide offices. Out of the 38 candidates, only six did not win their primary election. The high retention rate means that nearly all candidates that GSA-PAC supported will remain in positions to help protect physician-led healthcare and patient safety.

For the November 6 General Election, GSA has an opportunity to help 59 incumbent state senators and representatives who have demonstrated support for physicians and patients. GSA needs these people to win their General Election contests and return to the General Assembly in January.
